## WITH PISTOL AND POISON.

### Young John C. Reineke, Subject to Fits, Commits Suicide.

John C. Reineke, twenty-four years old, nephew of Emile F. Reineke, living at 20 Touro street, shot and killed himself in his bedroom at 10 o'clock last night, after taking a large dose of laudanum. Reineke was subject to epileptic fits, and is thought that he killed himself during one of them. He was not employed on account of these attacks, and was living with his uncle. Three years ago he attempted suicide by shooting himself through the mouth, as he did last night. On that occasion he was taken to the hospital, where he recovered.

John Reineke occupied a room on the lower floor, while his uncle slept on the second floor. The latter had just retired when he heard a pistol shot. Upon going down stairs he discovered his nephew lying on the floor with a 32-calibre revolver and a bottle of laudanum near by. A doctor was summoned, but life was exact before the physician arrived. The young man had not retired and was still in his street clothes. It is not known where he obtained the revolver with which he killed himself, nor the laudanum, as he was not allowed to have anything which would endanger his life. The reason for his killing himself is not known, unless it was during a fit.
