

# Deaths

East Gulf—Moderate north or northeast winds and partly overcast weather Thursday.

West Gulf—Moderate east or southeast winds over north portion and moderate northeast over south portion and fair weather Thursday.

Western Caribbean Sea and Windward Passage—Moderate to fresh winds, mostly northeast, and overcast weather, probably occasional showers Thursday.

Bermuda and Vicinity—Moderate to fresh shifting winds, becoming northeast or east, and overcast weather Thursday.

## WEATHER CONDITIONS

Moderately high pressure settles the Eastern states except the Florida peninsula. The pressure 29.29 to 30.28 inches from the Middle Mississippi valley to the North and Middle Atlantic states, and 29.98 inches at Key West, Fla. Rain is falling along the Atlantic coast, from Florida to Cape Hatteras, N. C. The pressure is moderately low over Northern California with 30.32 inches at Eureka. A trough of relatively low pressure extends from Alberta southward to Colorado, with lowest pressure 29.66 inches at Edmonton, Alberta. Warmer weather prevails in the Rocky Mountain states, the upper Missouri valley and the Ohio and Middle Mississippi valleys.

Fair to partly cloudy weather will prevail in this forecast district Thursday and Friday except for possible showers in the northwest portion. Rising temperature is indicated in most sections Thursday, and in the Lower Mississippi valley and East Gulf states Friday, with cooler Friday in the extreme western portion of the district.
