New Orleans is situated in 29° 22' Northern Latitude and 90° 16' Longitude West from Greenwich, which 100 miles from the mouth of the Mississippi.

The population, according to the Census and those of 1830, is estimated at 250,000, including the French and Spanish colonies, and the colored population, more than 100,000 individuals.

The extent generally covered by the city is estimated to contain in the year 1837, 25 to 30,000 acres of land, or 25 to 30 miles of frontage.

The French made a plan of the city in 1767, which has been since 1800, but remains unaltered in general features, although a strong current of 10,000 feet per second has advanced the Gulf Stream. The French and Spanish cities, unaltered and unimproved, but the American side has been extended to 15 miles, and increased to 25 miles.
