

Wallace Has Minor Surgery

Bullet Removal Area Has Infection

SILVER SPRING, Md. (AP)—Alabama Gov. George C. Wallace had minor surgery Thursday to remove infection which had accumulated near the abdomen under the skin.

Doctors at Holy Cross hospital said Wallace felt a "marked reduction" of abdominal pain after the incision was made to drain the pus from under the skin. They said the incision was made in the left lateral side of the abdomen under the skin.

Another accumulation of infection drained through stitches made when Wallace was operated on the night he was shot. Meanwhile, hospital officials said their switchboard has been deluged with crank callers who have claimed they have planted

a bomb in the building. No bombs have been found. In a hospital bulletin issued Thursday, doctors said they had anticipated the infections because of the nature of the injury to Wallace.

"After these areas were drained," the doctors said, "the patient's condition is improving, and a marked reduction in abdominal pain. Doctors said the remainder of the governor's condition continues stable in that his temperature, blood pressure and kidney function are all normal. They said the neurologic condition of Wallace's paralyzed legs remains unchanged.

A bomb signal unit has been stationed at the hospital and searches the eight-hour bulletin board after each bomb threat. Local law enforcement officials as well as FBI and Secret Service agents are keeping close guard on Wallace's room in the hallway. Montgomery County police and Maryland state police search the page at the hospital entrance and everybody who is allowed into the hospital must show identification cards or be on a special list of visitors and agents.

During the last few nights dozens of an injured motorcycle rider have circled the parking lot in cars. They said they objected to the hospital's rule put in effect since Wallace came that only next of kin are allowed into the hospital during the visiting hours. The hospital has 340 patients.

The interest of the people of Louisiana," he said. Rep. Edward LeBreton of New Orleans, charged by the governor with handling the measure in the lower house, also urged adoption of the plan. "It is PCT, DECREASE," the amended version of the bill contained provision for the 40 per cent decrease in bodily injury rates, but allowed exception at the discretion of the insurance commissioners. LeBreton, as a last-ditch effort to save the bill, agreed to remove what one attorney had labeled "the escape hatch."

John Avant, a Baton Rouge attorney, led off the opposition to the measure by charging that the no-fault plan conceived by the administration would have the effect of raising rates.

"The overall cost of auto insurance is going to be substantially greater than it is now," he added.

Avant called the guaranteed savings "absolutely illusory" and told committee members "the only way you're going to protect the public is you're going to build better highways and better cars. You're not going to do it by manipulating insurance."

New Orleans attorney John Martzell told the committee approval of a bill at the state level would be useless since provisions in the administration legislation fall far short of anticipated federal requirements.

Martzell said a bill passed out this week by the U.S. Senate commerce committee contains a \$1,000 threshold on medical payments and provides for \$75,000 for loss of income. He attacked also savings in insurance costs contemplated by backers of the Edwards-Sheridan legislation.

"The people of Louisiana would like to have rates reduced," he said. "Here we're talking about a four per cent reduction in total cost. Do the people of this state want to give up their rights to sue for about 85%?"

Gordon Flory, representing the state AFL-CIO, echoed Martzell.

"The people aren't willing to give up benefits to reduce rates at a negligible amount," he said.

Rep. Louise Johnson of Berwick moved to lay a favorable report to the bill, but Rep. John Hainkel of New Orleans objected.

"It's an injustice and an inequity to the people of Louisiana in its present form," he said.
